**TEMPORARY RESTRAINING ORDER AND ORDER
SETTING HEARING ON APPLICATION FOR TEMPORARY INJUNCTION**

After considering *Plaintiffs' Application for Temporary Restraining Order and Application for Temporary Injunction*, this Court finds there is evidence that harm is imminent to Plaintiffs, and if the Court does not issue the temporary restraining order and set a hearing for Plaintiffs' Application for Temporary Injunction, Plaintiffs will be irreparably injured.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that City of Houston, its agents, servants, employees, contractors, contract employees, attorneys, and those acting in concert with or in representation of City of Houston refrain from:

- (1) Changing, altering, destroying, removing, "bagging and tagging" or otherwise modifying any evidence possibly related to the explosion at the Watson facilities located at 4525 Gessner Road, Houston, Texas 77041, as depicted in Exhibit "A"; and
- (2) Changing, altering, destroying, removing, "bagging and tagging" or otherwise modifying any evidence possibly related to the explosion at the Watson facilities, including the 4500-4600 block of Steffani Lane.

It is further ORDERED that Plaintiffs' Application for Temporary Injection shall be heard on February 14, 2020 at 1:30 o'clock p.m., in the

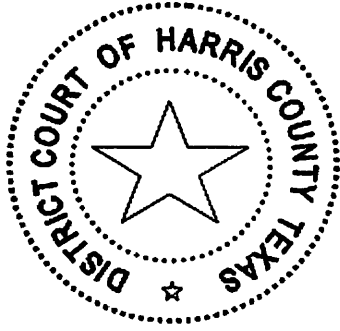
